Fiona Robinson joins us as a Library Technician working 3 days a week.


Assemblies

It has been wonderful to see parents and guardians joining us in our School Assemblies. Our initial Assembly was held in Week 3 to welcome our students back to school and to introduce our School Captains to the children. School Advisory Council

At St Martin's we are very fortunate to have a SAC with committed members that meets 6 times a year. We will have our first meeting for 2023 on Thursday 2 March. A brief summary of our meetings will be included in the school newsletter, which will be shared by our Chairperson, Jess Herrick (parent of two children in our school).

School Advisory Councils are advisory bodies which form an important expression of the educational partnership that exists between parents, schools, parishes and the wider community to support all students. This partnership is reflected in the ex-officio membership of both the principal and the parish priest on the council. What the council does is directed by the MACS board through the Terms of Reference for School Advisory Councils. The School Advisory Council provides a forum for discussion and discernment, where parent voice and community perspective are available to influence and support the decisions made by the principal and parish priest for the good of school and parish where students' wellbeing and outcomes are paramount.

Traffic Reminders

As a staff we continue to notice unsafe practices and receive regular emails and phone calls from parents and local residents about their concerns. Unfortunately some parents can at times be disrespectful to staff or other parents when reminded of safe practices.

Could I please remind you of the following;

- The 2 minute parking bays in Silk Street are in reality for dropping off only in the morning. Parents should not be parking their cars there and walking their children into the school. This area is managed by the council and should be viewed as a "Kiss and Drop" area.
- If using Bottom Yard to park at the end of the day please don't arrive before 3:05pm. This is when the gates will be opened and this allows 15 minutes to park before the dismissal bell. The line up of traffic along Lower Plenty Road is becoming more and more dangerous and a significant safety issue.
- Students are not to walk to parked cars on Bottom Yard without adult supervision. From 3:20pm cars begin to move and to exit the school grounds. Student safety is a priority here, not parent/adult convenience. We have a staff member on duty monitoring this practice.

You are welcome to join us in celebrating our Beginning of School Mass on Friday 17th of February in the Church. Mass will begin promptly at 9.15am.


Ash Wednesday Mass - Friday 22nd February at 9.15am

Thousands of people have been killed after a catastrophic 7.8 magnitude earthquake struck southeast Turkey (officially known as Türkiye) and Syria. Current reports indicate the death toll to be 12,000 and rising by the hour.

Freezing winter weather is adding to the devastation, as the thousands left injured, trapped or homeless are stuck in bitter cold and freezing rain. The quakes caused devastation in rebel-held northwest Syria, where entire buildings collapsed, leaving people trapped under the rubble. Turkey also hosts 3.6 million Syrian refugees, the greatest number of refugees in the world from that conflict. At least half a million refugees live in Gaziantep, where UNHCR runs one of its largest refugee responses.

We're in contact with Caritas Syria and other Caritas agencies on the ground as they assess the scale of the damage and critical needs. Your donation can help provide urgent aid and assistance to vulnerable communities affected by the earthquake. Starting the year right

Welcome to 2023. The holidays are over. School is back. And routines are recommencing. For many families this means:

- · extra stress (some kids don't feel excited about heading to kindy/prep/reception or school),
- · extra costs (let's face it, uniforms, shoes, and the rest of it all)
- · extra challenges (ADHD, dyslexia, other needs, friendship issues, learning difficulties).

Of course, it's not all bad news. Some families are delighted. Holidays create stress because of babysitting challenges, costs for entertainment, and more.

And fortunately, there are tens of thousands of our kids that actually enjoy school and are glad to be back.

As it happens – so are we! Parenting Ideas has been providing helpful parenting advice to parents in early learning centres, primary schools, and high schools around Australia, New Zealand, and the world for over two decades! This year it's no different.

How can we help?

As we dive into 2023, we want to know how we can be most useful to you. Headed up by Dr Justin Coulson, co-host and parenting expert of Channel Nine's Parental Guidance and host of Australia's #1 parenting podcast, Dr Justin Coulson's Happy Families, Justin and a team of experts will be bringing you a range of articles designed to give you the best parenting advice available to help make your family happier.

For the first Insights article of 2023, we're going to look at how we can get our routines on track at the outset and keep everyone focused on what matters most for making your family function.

Starting the year right

If you're like most parents, you really wanted to start things off well, but it's been a little rocky. Getting back into a routine, being on time, sorting out school lunches... it's a bit tricky. Best laid plans haven't quite been as smooth as you might have liked. To dial in your morning and evening routines, I'm going to suggest a few principles to help.

Get clear on what 'getting it right' actually means.

You might know what you want the morning to look like. But is it clear to you? Can you write it down? Can you put it on the fridge? Can you explain it to your kids and help them to buy into why it matters? Clearly explaining what you want and why is going to be a critical first step.

Set up a system.

Author, James Clear, says that "you do not rise to the level of your goals. You fall to the level of your systems." So what does your system look like for making things happen? Can you create a system that will facilitate a smooth morning for every member of the family?

Workshop it.

Setting up a system when you're a parent is pretty easy. But bringing the family along can be trickier. By having a meeting and developing the system with input from your kids, you get to be clear, establish the system, and create buy-in. Ask your children to make suggestions and design the morning based on their ideas. Fashion it with your expert knowledge. And watch the results improve because your children have been part of it. Involvement is a central success pillar when it comes to developing a system that works in any family.

Curate competence.

The real secret to successful routines is helping the kids become self-sufficient. It takes time, but teaching them to toast their bread or crumpets, fry or scramble some egg, or organise their cereal or yogurt, or even blend a smoothie means that there is less friction with your routine. They feel good about doing what needs to be done because they know how to do it. And while it's slow at first, it becomes wonderfully efficient over time.

Support autonomy.

Kids love to have choices. They appreciate being able to make their own decisions. Support them in that while ensuring they know what the guidelines and boundaries are for making things happen well.

Here are the golden rules of a magic morning (from a dad of six who has talked with thousands of parents about getting this right):

- Your morning begins the night before. Get the prep done for tomorrow at bedtime so uniforms are ready, bags are packed, and library books or sports gear is sorted.
- Create margin by waking up a little early, and getting the kids up (gently) a little early too.Room to breathe makes everything work better.
- 3. Create the structure so everyone knows what needs to be done.
- 4. Keep the kids accountable in a supportive way.

In spite of your best efforts, things will go pear-shaped now and then. When this happens, stay calm (remember: emotions are contagious), don't sweat the small stuff, be flexible for the morning... but get it back on track the next day by having a calm conversation in the evening, reinforcing the system, and working together on making it work.

Whether it's magic mornings or excellent evenings, the process is the same. Work as a team, and watch the magic happen... at least sometimes.

We will be offering two Parent Helper Sessions to new families who have not participated in the program before. You will only need to attend one.



WEEKLY REFLECTIONS PROJECT COMPASSION - ASH WEDNESDAY Written by Michael McGirr

It was not many years ago that every school and parish had an incinerator. At our school, one of the jobs of the class monitor was to take out the trash and set fire to it. It is uncomfortable to think now about how much soot we put into the atmosphere. Not to mention the fumes of burning plastic and other things. The word recycling was still a few years away; frankly, it's a pity it didn't enter our vocabulary a bit sooner. One time, two members of our class decided to start throwing ash at each other. They made an unholy mess and ended up looking like wrecks. The teacher made them write out fifty times the line from today's Psalm: 'O wash me more and more from my guilt.' With benefit of hindsight, I can see that the Psalm has bigger things on its mind than ten-year-olds getting dirty in the incinerator.

The focus of the Psalm is far more on God's mercy and kindness than our silly behaviour. It asks for strength, a 'steadfast spirit.' It also asks for the gift of intimacy with God. 'Do not cast me away from your presence. 'Later, I discovered that at school the teachers used ashes from the incinerator to place on our foreheads on Ash Wednesday. I don't think this was the correct procedure and was, I think, a matter of convenience. Yet it does seem to make a point. When we receive the ashes, we are asked to remember that we are dust and will return to dust.

The journey of Lent takes us in hope from a place of humility to one of light. The things we throw away, the people we disregard, are the very place we can encounter God. Project Compassion, organised by Caritas Australia, is a great way of embracing the journey of Lent. It asks us to remember that there are people in the world who are often treated like rubbish. Metaphorically, they live among the ashes. Our decisions can make a huge impact on helping them journey with hope into light.

The rituals of Ash Wednesday have a special meaning for all of us. They call us to recognise the humanity we share with others and to return with our hearts to the God of justice. Like Mary, we are called to be a blessing for all generations to come.




